



PUBLIC MEETING

Woodman Avenue Median Retrofit Project



Meeting sponsored by the Panorama City Neighborhood Council, Los Angeles Department of Water and Power, Department of Public Works, and The River Project.

WHAT: Learn about the Woodman Avenue Multi-Beneficial Stormwater Capture and Median Retrofit Project, and provide input on design to the project team.

WHEN: 6:30 PM on Tuesday Jun 28, 2011

WHERE: Kaiser Permanente Campus, 13652 Cantara Street North 2 Building, classrooms 1 & 2

Project Description: The project will retrofit the 3,500 foot long concrete median running along the west side of Woodman Avenue from Lanark Street to Saticoy Street in order to recharge the groundwater basin, improve water quality, alleviate local flooding and enhance the community. The project will capture surface stormwater that currently flows into the Los Angeles River and out to the ocean. Flows will be re-directed into a naturalized vegetated swale for infiltration. The project, part of the Tujunga/Pacoima Watershed Plan, will include an educational stakeholder component in order to promote environmental stewardship. Construction should begin at the end of 2011 and be complete by the end of 2012.



Project Costs: The overall project cost is \$3.4M, with \$1.7M from State Prop 50 funds, \$1M LADWP funds, & \$750,000 in staff support cost from the Dept of Public Works, Bureau of Sanitation. The project will be constructed by the Dept of Public Works, Bureau of Street Services.
